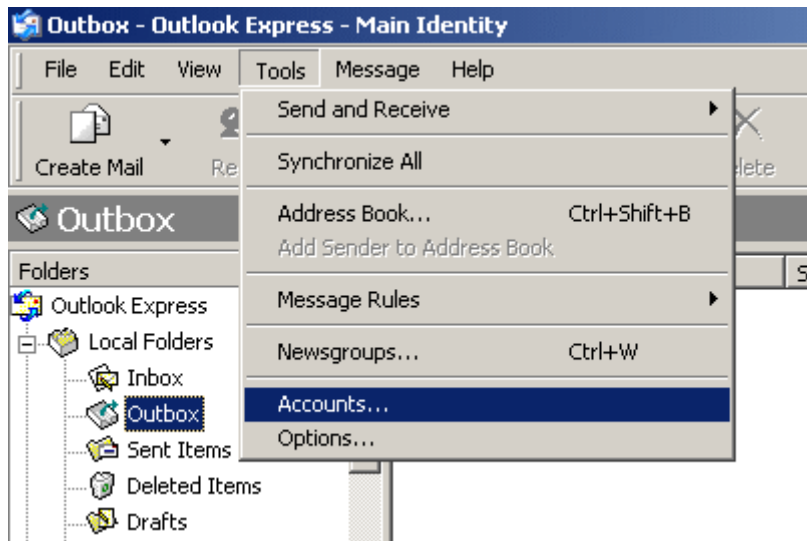
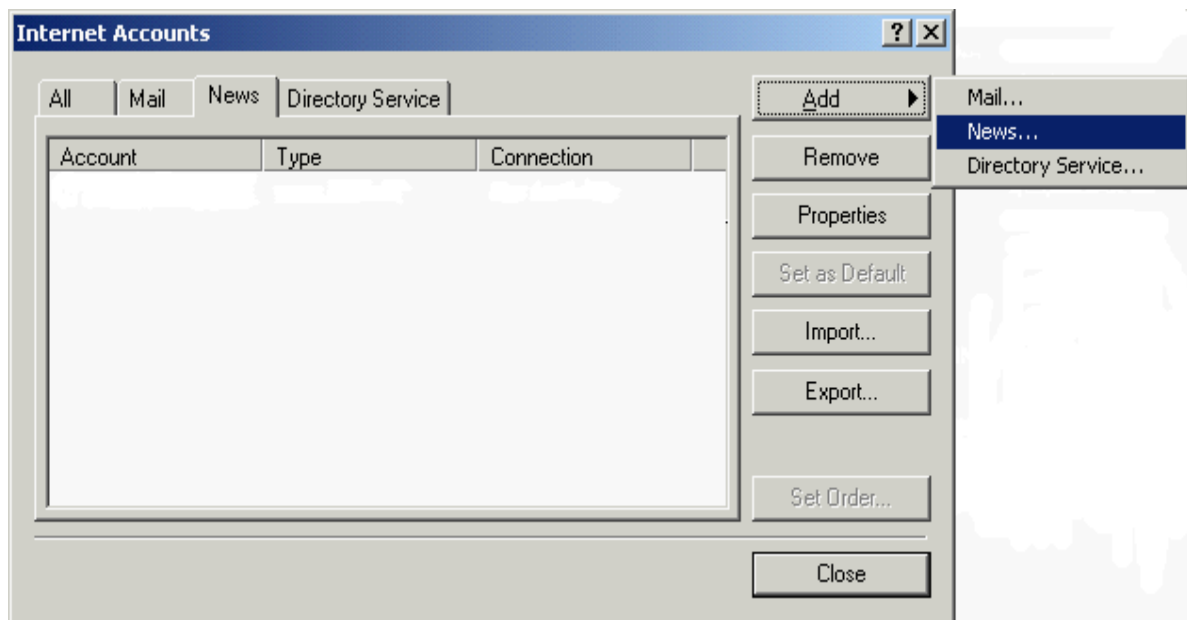


Setting Up Usenet In Outlook Express (Dial-up customers) – Montreal-DSL

Open **Outlook Express**. Go to the **Tools** menu, choose **Accounts**.



When the **Internet Accounts** box opens, choose **Add - News**.



This will then start the **Internet Connection Wizard**.

Type in your **Display Name** (**this can be any name desired (e.g. your full name, your nickname, or anything else)**), and will appear in the From field on each outgoing mail message.

Note: this name can be entered however you wish--all capitals, a mix of capitals and lowercase, etc.

When you are finished typing your name, click the **Next** button to continue.

Type the name of the Internet news (NNTP) server your Internet service provider has given you.

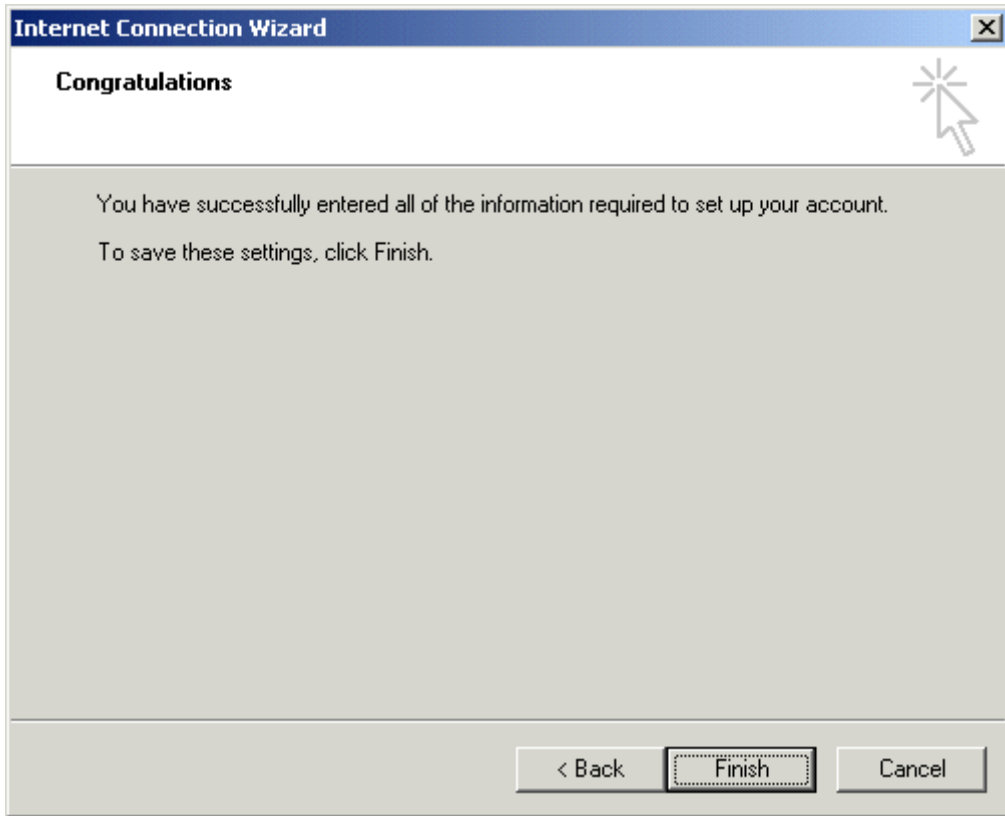
News (NNTP) server:

If your Internet service provider has informed you that you must log on to your news (NNTP) server and has provided you with an NNTP account name and password, then select the check box below.

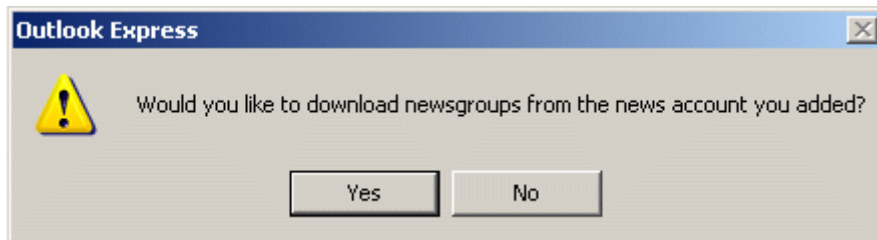

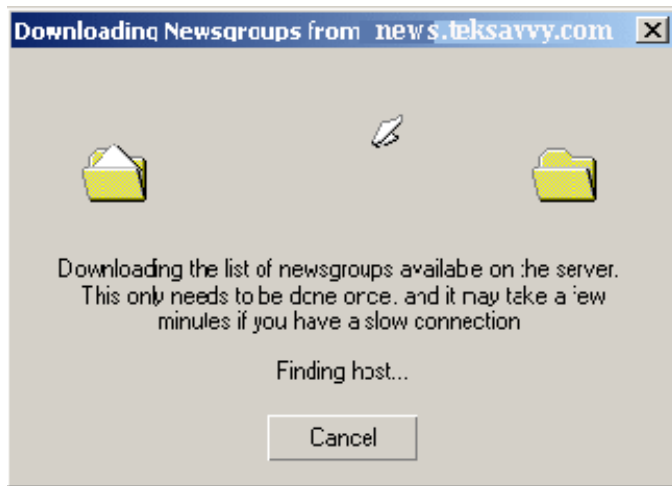
You have now successfully set up this account. Click **Finish**:
